Although enough food is produced globally to feed the world, hunger persists – largely the product of various and severe inequalities. This year's Global Hunger Index analyses how inequalities, for example related to geography, ethnicity, gender, socio-economic status or access to power, have a direct influence on a person's nutritional status.

Neither hunger and inequality are inevitable; they are influenced by laws, policies and practices. Which groups of society are most at risk? Which strategies are realistic and effective in combating inequality and hunger? And is it possible to achieve Zero Hunger by 2030 with the current levels of inequality? We want to discuss these questions and more with experts from politics, civil society and academia.
