01:21-01:52	To camera interview with Leticia, 19: I heard about this organisation and I applied and I was taken by God's grace. I'm here now, it's all fine. The beginning was somehow hard but nowadays it's good. I like the way the instructor does things. He's so good. With him around, I will get what I want and become what I want to become.
01:53-02:19	To camera interview with Leticia, 19: In the future, after here, I know I will be able to do something on my own now. Everything he has given me is fine. I dream of becoming self-employed. I've never liked working under someone.



02:20-02:52	To camera interview with Leticia, 19: [Talking about integration - Ugandan/South Sudanese]: It's good to stay with them and also to learn a new language. We have our differences but it's not a problem to me. We are happy with them, we help each other. Sometimes if they do not the language that we speak we can advise friends to help them in their own language. It's good to stay with them, to have new friends. The South Sudanese, the Congolese - it's all good.
02:53-03:25	Carpenter Francis Lukuyu, 25, works in Bidi Bidi camp after training at Welthungerhilfe's Skills Training Center. He has also taught his brother (who is in the shot).
03:26-03:35	To camera interview with Francis Lukuyu, 25: I'm Francis Lukuyu, a refugee from Bidi Bidi settlement. I am now a carpenter who got an opportunity from Welthunger[hilfe].
03:36-03:48	To camera interview with Francis Lukuyu, 25: We did a training for six months, after that we graduated and were given start-up tools. After that I came to my place and opened a workshop. Right now, I am getting money from it.
03:49-04:02	To camera interview with Francis Lukuyu, 25: I came to Uganda in October [2016] when the war broke our in our village. We found no place to stay on and decided to come to Uganda. Right now we're in Uganda.
04:04-04:27	In my future I want to upgrade and do more skills to help my family. I am dreaming in my future of taking my child to a better school and also hoping - if the opportunities will come - that some friends and brothers of mine will get the same skillset and will also be able to help themselves.
